We are looking for a Science teacher to join our Middle and Upper School team (KS3 and KS4). Successful applicants will have proven experience in delivering the GCSE curriculum to KS4 pupils and well as teaching across KS3 or Middle School in a Steiner setting, have passion and enthusiasm for their subject, and interest in joining a growing Steiner School. **The successful candidate will combine an excellent track record of classroom experience; a clear sympathy with the ethos of our school and interest in integrating the National Curriculum with the Steiner Waldorf approach to the Sciences; and the ability to contribute to the development of a strong curriculum.**

Steiner Academy Bristol is a new state-funded Steiner school in an urban area. We are an all-through school (ages 4-16) and once we have filled all of our year groups, we will have grown to 624 pupils.

The school is based in Fishponds, Bristol. You will be supported by a senior management team including a Principal, SENCo and leadership team.

Our ethos and values

Our vision is for a school in which all children can fully experience the wonders of Steiner education: maintaining childhood; thinking independently, clearly and considerately; observing the world perceptively; and acting with creativity, courage and self-determination.

Main responsibilities of the post

- To teach your subject(s) and to promote an awareness of your subject across the school.
- To work within the teaching group to help the smooth day-to-day running of the whole school
- To support the school's ethos, principles and objectives
- To undertake appropriate preparation, study and training as necessary both for the effective discharge of this role and also to advance the school's ethos, principles and objectives
- To be aware of the school's policies and procedures and to support their implementation

Further duties will include:

- Contributing to parents' evenings
- Attending staff meetings at least once a week
- Participating in work, study and INSET days as required
- Contributing to school events and festivals throughout the year

The above list is not exclusive or exhaustive and the post holder will be required to undertake such duties as may reasonably be expected within the scope of the post. All members of staff are required to be professional, co-operative and flexible and undergo reasonable and directed professional development. This may require out of 'normal hours' and personal study which may be unpaid.

- An understanding of the Steiner-Waldorf approach to teaching and / or a willingness to learn and develop your teaching practice
- A demonstrable commitment to effective professional development and ongoing learning
- Proven ability to work in a team
- A flexible and positive attitude to work
- Good communication skills with children, parents and colleagues
- Willingness to undertake an enhanced DBS check
- Permission to work in the UK prior to being selected for interview

Desirable

- Experience of working in a Steiner school or Steiner-inspired educational environment
- Awareness of the challenges and opportunities for a state-funded Steiner school
- A track record of involvement with new and innovative projects

Pay and conditions

The full-time salary for teachers in our school is £23,701 to £34,983p.a.

This role will be part-time, 0.8 FTE, including time for lesson preparation, staff meetings and INSET days and as the school grows there is the potential for this to become a full-time role.
